EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING FEBRUARY 16, 1982

Present: P. Boger, F. Bright, S. Edgar, E. Jakubauskas, J. Johnston, D. Meisel, R. Owens, A. Reid, W. Rhodes, L. Ruddy, D. Thomas

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m.

The minutes of the last Executive Committee meeting were approved.

Pres. Jakubauskas reported on the activities of the Federal-State Relations Committee, of which he is a member, in Washington, D. C. The members of the committee met with various Senators and other governmental officials to express their concern about Federal Budget cuts to education, especially in areas of student aid. Pres. Jakubauskas indicated that details on the scope and effect of the cuts will be published in the forthcoming Compass. Among the effects of the proposed Federal Budget is the fact that students from families with an income of 15,000 or more will find themselves ineligible for loans and other kinds of assistance. Pres. Jakubauskas appeared on Channel 13 voicing his concern about Federal treatment of education.

On the State level, Pres. Jakubauskas reported that many individuals and agencies are hard at work to convince the State Legislature to amend the proposed Budget. He expects that hard data on the results of efforts to sway Legislators toward a more favorable distribution of funds for education will soon be in his hands, at which time he will distribute that information.

BUDGET - F. Bright pointed to the resolution to be brought up before the Faculty Senate concerning the letter on the Budget addressed to Assemblyman James Emery. He was concerned with the notation "First Reading," suggesting that the matter was significant enough to admit of no delay. Since it seems imperative to get the letter out quickly, the words "First Reading" were deleted from the Agenda.

FACULTY AFFAIRS - J. Johnston reported receiving a memo from J. McNally on CIE's, and another from L. Blackman. W. Rhodes reported that he had received a letter from P. MacLean on a matter that might be handled by the Faculty Affairs Committee. The letter suggested changing Article III, Section 7: a.2 of the Constitution of the Faculty to read:

Each member must have continuing appointment and hold the rank of Professor or Librarian on the Teaching Faculty.

The change will make eligible Library personnel able to serve on the Faculty Personnel Committee. In his examination of the Constitution, W. Rhodes found nothing which seemed to prevent this editorial change. He will subject the matter to further scrutiny.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Pres. Jakubauskas expanded his report of the recent Federal-State Relations Committee meeting in Washington, D. C. which is included in this week's Executive Committee minutes. He indicated that Federal Cuts in New York State amount to 179 million. On the State level Chancellor Wharton and others are urging a more equitable distribution of funds to education than is contained in the proposed Budget. This week seemed to Pres. Jakubauskas to be a critical one in affecting change. As the proposed budget now stands students will be hit in areas of aid, loans, work study, and other monetary assistance.

W. Rhodes pointed to the request for nominations for the Spring election from the Nominations and Elections Committee, a request printed on p. 195 of Faculty Senate.
