EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING
MARCH 30, 1982

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m.

The minutes of the last Executive Committee meeting were approved.

Pres. Jakubauskas reviewed the latest information on budgetary matters on both the Federal and State levels. He saw some bright spots on the Federal level where bargaining for more equitable distribution of funds for education is strong. At the State level the news is not as promising. The budget is currently before the Legislature, and Pres. Jakubauskas indicated that he expects news on the budget before the end of the week at which time he will pass that news on to the Senate Chairman. Pres. Jakubauskas also indicated that the matter of retrenchment now appears not to be as dismal as originally expected. Faculty attrition is part of the picture here. However, the budget will not leave much room for slack to work within. It is not likely that retrenchment will be necessary in the faculty area. Pres. Jakubauskas also pointed to a new budgetary system involving the pooling of dollars and positions among SUNY institutions, the effect of which will be to allow these institutions to meet their needs more equitably.

UNIVERSITY SENATOR - G. Smith added some comments to F. Bright's report, indicating that his reading of newspaper articles on the budget shows some leverage for a favorable amending of the budget. He stated that the next meeting of the University Faculty Senate will be held in two weeks in Cornell.

CENTRAL COUNCIL - J. Teahan reported that the student rally on the budget received coverage from the media and made an impact on budgetary considerations. A phone-in was held after the rally with students calling legislators about the budget. On March 12 Teahan met with Chancellor Wharton who will meet again with student presidents late in April to discuss better communications with these student presidents.
